They brought 20 XO laptops with them, and we have just set up a computer lab for the children’s use at the Center. The kids are extremely excited and loving every moment they get to be in front of the new laptops. Steven Amara, AAO’s Country Director in Sierra Leone, says: *“The Children’s Center has now been turned into a virtual music studio. Everywhere you go you’ll hear the happy noises and the sounds of different instruments being played on the computer systems.”*



With the new laptops, the children can create their own songs and explore their creative sides. It’s been a wonderful gift! And on top of it all, the kids get to participate in a documentary film, which is also teaching them a lot about film production.

The documentary crew should wrap-up filming in Sierra Leone by the end of August, and the film will then be premiered at the **Elevate Film Festival** in Los Angeles, California on October 5, 2008 (www.elevateexperience.com). It is our hope that the film will inspire people and also bring more attention to the needs for the children in Sierra Leone.
