It's been a difficult month for the Children's Center in Sierra Leone. The heavy rains have made the dirt roads almost impassable, electricity has been in extremely short supply, and our generator has been broken/fixed/broken several times. On top of that, we've had a terrible problem with a leak in the roof of our building, and the repair men have not been able to find the source in order to fix it! Through it all, the children have been coping, and we've continued to provide the best possible care for them – but **our general fund is at the lowest point it has been all year**. We urgently need your donations, so that we can meet our expenses for the coming weeks. On a brighter note, this month we received the remaining \$24,000 needed to complete our six-acre land purchase in Grafton, Sierra Leone! 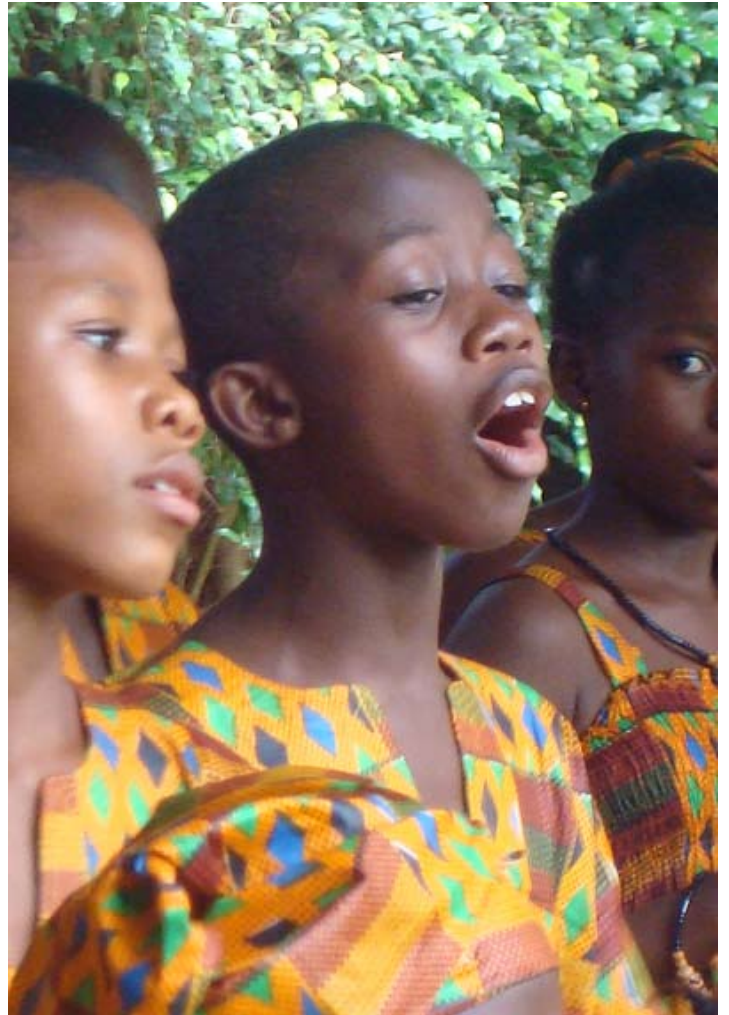
HearMe Update

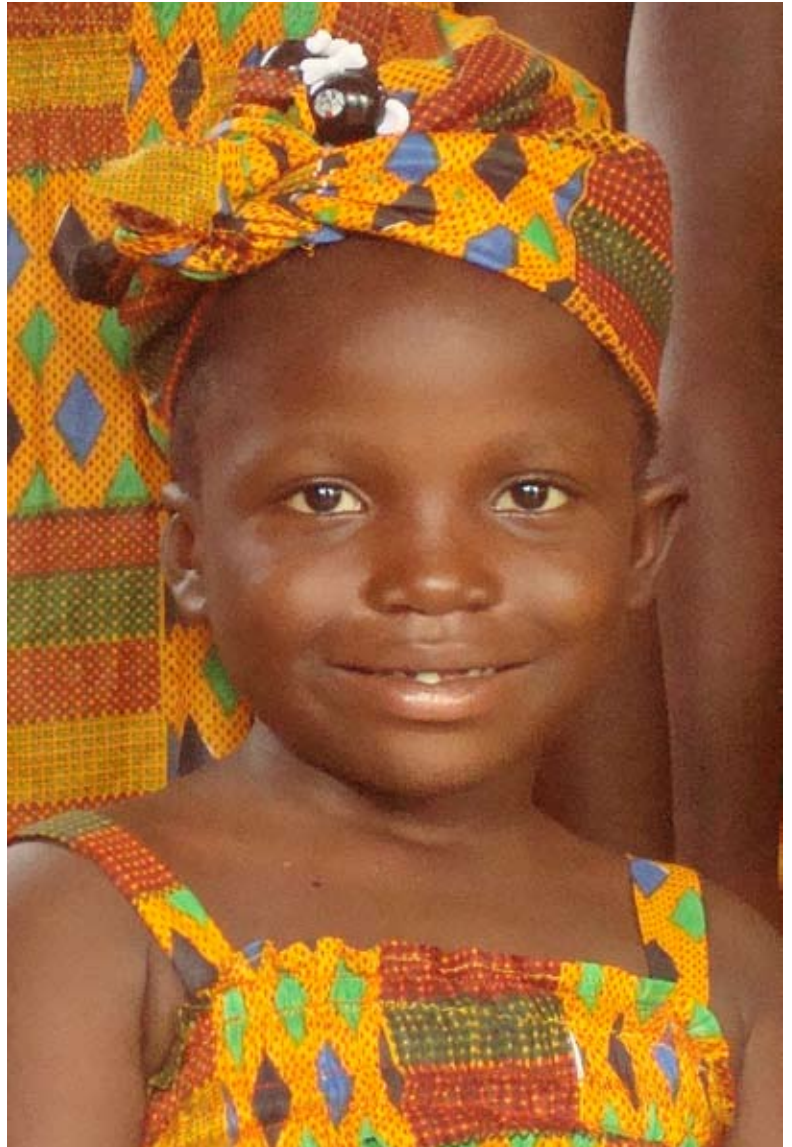


THE CHILDREN NEED YOUR HELP!

I still enjoy brunches and everything Dubai has to offer, but I now sponsor two children. We write to them and send pictures, so they know someone else cares and thinks of them. We send ad hoc small donations, so the children can have outings and extras, and I give my spare time volunteering."

For Jocelyn's birthday, in October, she has asked her husband, Doug, to go online and "gift her" by sponsoring two more children on her behalf. Through Jocelyn's passion and drive, she has secured new sponsors.
